### Bram Stoker (1847-1912):

Born Abraham Stoker in Dublin, Ireland, Stoker was a civil servant, drama critic, personal manager to Sir Henry Irving, as well as the author of fifteen books. In 1906, Stoker published *The Personal Reminiscences of Henry Irving*. However, he is best known for the classic horror novel *Dracula*, first published in 1897, that continues to inspire screen adaptations to the present day.

### Titles

**Dracula** \$ 2.00 476K

*Dracula*, the classic that secured lasting fame for author Bram Stoker, is told entirely through journal entries. The tale begins with Jonathan Harker's journey to visit the mysterious count on a legal matter, unaware of his pale host's unique tastes. Soon, he and a small group of friends are caught in a battle against an humanity's darkest threat. First published in 1897.

**Dracula's Guest** FREE 16 K

*Dracula's Guest* was originally written as part of Bram Stoker's classic horror novel, *Dracula* (1897). This portion was removed by the publishers due to the length of the book as a whole. Only later was the omitted portion published as a short story and now, finally, as a HandStory Classic eBook edition. First published in 1914.

**The Jewel of Seven Stars** FREE 274 K

Bram Stoker's *The Jewel of Seven Stars*, written at a time when the British Empire was intact and the trade in Egyptian antiquities was prevalent, suggests that danger may persist for centuries. When an Egyptologist attempts to raise the mummy of an ancient Egyptian Queen, his daughter becomes possessed and he falls into a trance. It will be up to barrister Malcolm Ross to try to save them both. First published in 1902.

**The Lady of The Shroud** \$ 1.00 392 K

With *The Lady of the Shroud*, the legendary "creator" of *Dracula* returns with another story of the undead... or is it? When a wealthy merchant falls in love with a woman who may or may not be a vampire, Bram Stoker's readers are taken on an engaging adventure more action-oriented than most of his stories. First published in 1909.

**The Lair of The White Worm** FREE 176 K

With *The Lair of The White Worm*, Bram Stoker returns with a tale of evil. From the white worm slithering below to the infestation of birds above, as well as the hypnotist who is destroying his own lover, Stoker knows how to mesmerize his readers. First published in 1911.

**The Man** FREE 318 K

With *The Man*, Bram Stoker tells a story more romance than adventure, in the Victorian-Edwardian style. Originally published c.1905.
